

I am directed by the Secretary of State for India to refer to Resolution No. 31 adopted by the recent Eastern Africa Indian National Congress at Nairobi. This resolution represents that certain claims of Indians in the Kisi District whose property was looted by native tribesmen in 1914 are payable by the Government and that the matter is not a proper one for submitting claims to the Foreign Claims Office, to which the Claimants would seem to have been referred, inasmuch as the natives concerned belonged to the district and did not come from German territory; the resolution also apparently alleges that money in respect of the claims has already been realised.

I am to enquire whether any information as to the circumstances referred to in this resolution can be communicated to this Department.
