

Sir,

I am directed by Mr. Secretary General of State, for the information of Vincent Milner, that a letter has been received from the Government of India asking that they may be furnished with any information which may be available as to the scope and object of the recent change in the status of the East Africa Protectorate.

Mr. Montagu has seen a copy of the Order in Council which came into operation on the 23rd July annexing that part of the Protectorate which is now known under the name of the Kenya Colony. He understands that a further Order in Council is to be passed establishing the Kenya Protectorate which is to consist of the Sultan of Zanzibar's mainland dominions.

He would be glad to have any supplementary information which can be furnished in reply to the Government of India's enquiry. In particular he would be glad to learn whether the Legislative Council of the old East Africa Protectorate will continue to represent both parts of the territory as now divided.
