I am directed by the Secretary of State for India to refer to India Office letter dated 22nd October, No. J & P. 1920/20 regarding the sale by auction of certain business plots at Nairobi.

I am to transmit copy of a telegram from the Government of India on the subject of a notification which appears to have been made in the Kenya official Gazette enforcing racial segregation at Nairobi. The lines of the scheme proposed by Professor Simpson.

Secretary Montagu supports the view urged by the Government of India's telegram that it would be of advantage to hold these orders in abeyance pending consideration of their despatch on the subject of Indian disabilities in Kenya which is now on its way from India, and he would be glad to know whether Viscount Milner sees his way to accepting this suggestion.
