Re Mr. C. Perry, 2/Collyer's Hill, Shrewsbury; Applicant for
Special Priority Passage to East Africa.
Medical Examination of

Sir,

I have the honour to report in conformity with your
letter of 21st November, 1920, 8539/1919 and enclosures, that I have
to-day medically examined Mr. C. Perry of Shrewsbury. He brought with
him a certificate from Dr. R. O. Smyth, 3 College Hill, Shrewsbury, that
he has been attending Mr. Perry for Chronic Rheumatism since his
discharge from the Army and recommended him a change of climate
to such a place as East Africa.

I understand from Mr. Perry that he is at present working with
the Great Western Railway in connexion with "gas eng. car" which
involves much railway travelling; that he has to be helped in &
out of carriages & and that on many occasions "collapse"
while driving and his heart is nervous. The symptoms are chiefly of
the hands and of gait. The pains are chiefly of
the shoulder, elbow, hip, knee and ankle joints. There is some enlargement
of his ankle joints of a chronic nature. His knees show no signs
present of rheumatic affection. I believe he suffers from chronic
rheumatism, but I am unable to certify that there is a real risk
of death or permanent injury. He is not allowed to proceed to
East Africa.
