Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that Sergeant J. Healy of the Survey Department is due to proceed to England in July next on termination of his engagement, and that on the recommendation of the Director of Surveys, I propose, subject to your approval, to sanction the appointment of 2nd Corporal H. Thornton to fill the vacancy caused by his departure.

2. I would also ask, if my action meets with your approval, that you would approach the War Office with a view to obtaining a new Non-Commissioned Officer or Sapper with a good knowledge of plane-tableing.

3. His salary would be £215 per annum plus £36 house allowance, and his engagement, which should date from January 19th 1913, would be for a period of three years, including six months leave to England, with free passages.

4. In this connection the Director of Surveys has mentioned the name of Lance Corporal A. J. Turner, Royal Engineers, who was formerly employed in Nigeria, or, failing him, either Sapper W.



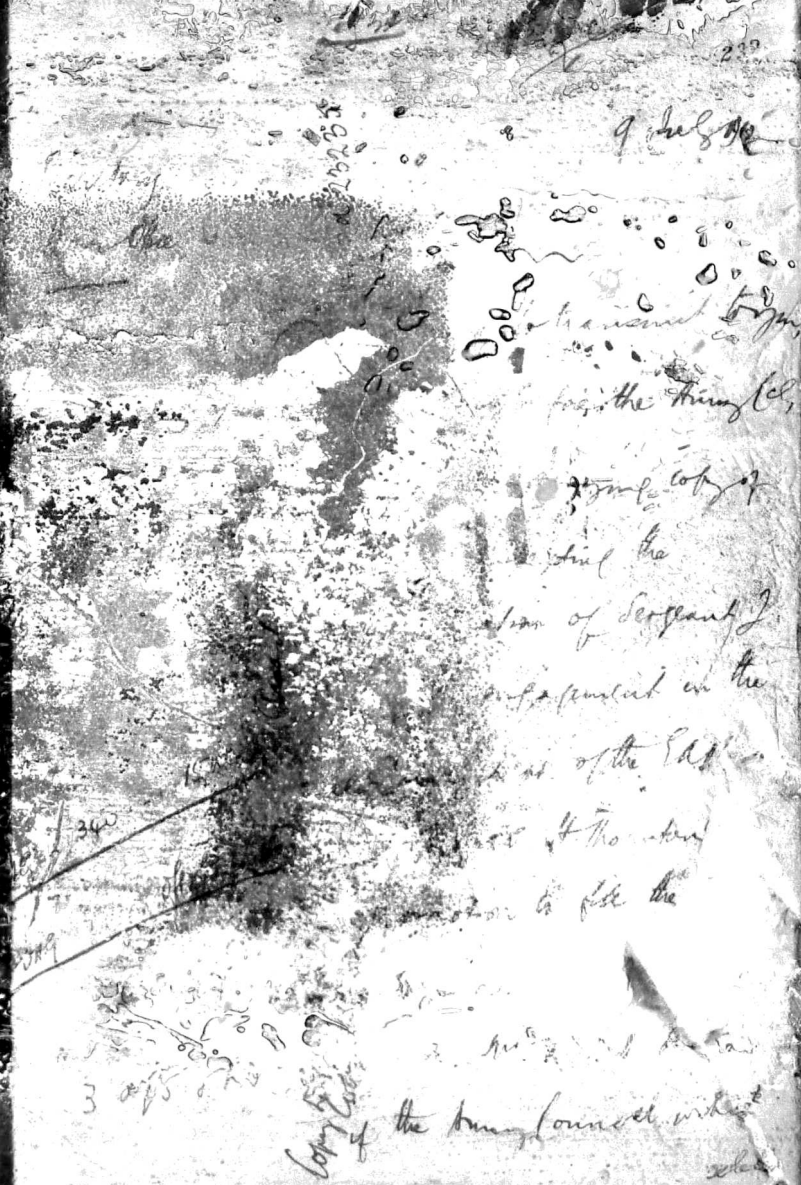
