Sir,

I have the honour to bring to your notice the case of No. 3160 Constable Hussein bin Abdulla who joined the East Africa Police originally on the 21st October 1899 and served continuously until the 5th December 1910 when he took his discharge as time expired having completed 11 years and 46 days service with a very good character. After an absence of 6 months and 8 days he joined the Water Police on the 13th March 1911, which body has now been absorbed into the regular Protectorate Police, and comes again under the provisions of the Police Ordinance.

2. In the terms of Section 50 (4) of the Police Ordinance No. 4 of 1911 an Asiatic or African constable whose re-enlistment is accepted within three months of having received a certificate of discharge is entitled to the advantages to which he was entitled with regard to rank, grade or gratuity at the time of his discharge but any break in the service beyond three months has to be referred for special sanction.

Abdulla is not entitled to count his previous Police service as at the time of his discharge he was serving under the 1906 Police Ordinance in which no provision was made for gratuities, but, in view of the peculiar circumstances arising from the Water Police being amalgamated with the Protectorate Police, I recommend that he be allowed to count his past service viz: from 21st October 1899 to the 5th December 1910 towards gratuity but that the period between the latter date and the 13th March 1911, the day on which he joined the Water Police, be not taken into account.

4. Having regard to the man's long and good record of service, I trust that you will entertain this recommendation favourably.


