
LEGAL REPORT.

This Ordinance authorises the raising of a loan of £250,000, and provides that the moneys raised shall be expended on the purposes for which the loan has been sanctioned, and that the payment of interest and sinking fund on the loan shall be made in accordance with the terms of the Finance Act, 1911.

2. As the Ordinance has been passed on the instructions of the Secretary of State, I am of opinion that His Excellency the Acting Governor can forthwith give his assent to the Ordinance.
