been sent on leave at the end of 1 year &

have had his six months ordinary leave
plus an extraordinary or permittive term of
leave with pay from Colo Post funds until
fit to rejoin his Corps. In this case alone
I think we need not object to his having the
full six months. Further it would certainly be
hard to dock his leave which he could
probably have taken earlier if he had found
for it - because he could not stay till the
next boat. These men are very useful to
us & we might well choose not to do anything to
make the work unprofitable.

Sir,

With reference to my despatch No. 340 of the 15th ultimo, I have the honour to report that I am allowing Sergeant Healy to proceed to England by the June instead of July boat as his health has been so unsatisfactory of late that he is quite unable to perform his duties properly. He will therefore only have completed 29 months service, and I am uncertain as to the amount of leave which may be granted him. It has been suggested that he should forfeit one thirtieth of the six months leave to which he would have been entitled had he served for 30 months, but this implies a partial application of the new leave rules, which however are not applicable to Officers and Non-Commissioned Officers of the Trigonometrical and Topographical Branch of the Survey Department - vide your telegram of September 12th 1911. If the old leave rules are to govern this case Sergeant Healy will only be entitled to five months leave, which I submit would be somewhat hard on him.
