Thika Tramway	£20,000
Mombasa Water Supply	£60,000.

2. The approximate expenditure on the Thika Tramway and Mombasa Water Supply up to 31st May 1912 was £45,520 and £8,600 respectively.

3. No estimate of the amount that will be required for the deep water Pier at Mombasa can be given until the design of the pier is completed. See paragraph 5<sup>o</sup> of my despatch of 11th June 1912.

I have the honour to ask that your formal sanction may be given to expend in 1912-13 the unexpended balance, amounting to £47,071, of the special grant for Magadi (1911-12) of £75,000.

2. In the Fourth Supplementary Estimate, Item 31, a sum of £66,600 was included for Special Expenditure for Magadi covered by the grant of £75,000.

3. Of the amount so voted only £27,929 was expended, and I have the honour to request that a revote be made of £38,671 (i.e. £66,600 less £27,929) being the unexpended balance of sum voted in 1911-12, and your sanction accorded for the expenditure of £38,671, being the amount remaining (in balances) of the grant of £75,000.

4. The amount unexpended has not been taken into consideration as savings to cover additional expenditure during the year.
