East Africa it is 30 lbs. It is unanimously admitted by naturalists and sportsmen that the only weight which will safeguard the female elephant and the young herd bulls is 30 lbs. It is therefore earnestly recommended that the weight of 30 lbs may be taken as the international standard. However, than less the negotiations come to nothing for the reason that 30 lbs is considered to high it will be better to accept 25 lbs as the standard but any reduction much below this weight would be of little or no value as a means of preserving the elephants.

The following regulations are suggested for International adoption. They are simple and would give highest protection.

- i. Possession of rhinoceros horns only be lawfully obtained legally by purchase from a licensed dealer.
- (b) When purchased from a person who has been registered by Government and after payment of a sum in consideration bearing an official stamp.
- ii. It should be illegal to import into any country weighing 30 lbs per head.




