The land situated to the east of Mbaraki creek on Mombasa Island which is believed to be the property of the Government but which has been claimed by the Tangana and the Sherifu, is about 250 acres in extent. The value is estimated at about £15,000; but the Tangana sold 6 acres at the beginning of the year to Mr. Morrison for £36 and 30 acres to Messrs. Long & Sons for £180. The latter plot has since been sold to Mr. H. Killam, wealthy American settler, for a larger sum. The land claimed by the Sherifu is 52 acres in extent and was purchased from a Tangana by Pigott on behalf of the Government in 1896.

It is believed that at that time this was the limit of the cultivated area and that the rest of the land was waste and therefore regarded as Government land. In any case no land has been marked on all maps since the advent of the J. B. E. A. Co as belonging to the Government. The Government has however taken steps to occupy effectively or develop it by laying claim to obsolete settlement areas or reserves land. Beyond making a path across the land near Nombasa in 1898 and leasing a large portion of it in 1904 to Captain Grapen, who has done nothing the East Africa Estates, Ltd., and to various Planters with it, no attempt has been made to show people that it belongs to the Government, as ex-slaves and others have squatted on this part of the cultivated area, that he purchased from and cultivated patches without being the rightful owner, that the remainder of the land

If the Tongana and Kerife win the present election, not only will it affect the Geogea case, but all the waste land between Riwatwa (30 miles south of Nombasa) and Tiva (20 miles south of Mombasa) must, when the Land Titles Court sits in the Mombasa District, be awarded to the Tiva tribe and Thabtha Tiva, the two Nokomisian federations. Mr. Pajotto's evidence is chiefly required to show that the leases granted were invalid.

Mr. Pajotto's evidence is chiefly required to show that the land he purchased in 1898 was the part of the cultivated area, that he purchased from and cultivated patches without being the rightful owner, that the remainder of the land

(i.e. the land now claimed by the Tanganyika) was regarded by the natives as waste land and as to the Government, and that there was therefore necessity to purchase this land to enable the Govt to acquire it.

Mr Pigott was the only European who from 1896 dealt with the land questions on Mombasa Island. His two successors Mr Crawford & Mr Tu are both dead, so that their evidence is unobtainable.
