Having read Sir Percy Gircuard's syeach I feel uneasy as to whether the Laikipia ground to be thrown open to the settlers who are going from this district.

Expectation of this and that I have sheep ready to ship, whenever a best can be set, they are seing along with those of Er.Randall, Eiddenin. Can you tell us if laskipia is or is not to be available for settlement, as if not, I will have to make new arrangements. I have between four and five thousand pounds eventually to put into the country, about 1600s at present and the balance when my contracts and leases expire here and I mish to try E.E.A.

Some information one way or the other will be of great assistance to se, as I am hesitating whether to send sy family to angland or to keep them here pending the throwing open of the ground.
