Sir,

With reference to your despatch No. 357 of the 21st of June, I have the honour to transmit herewith six copies of the revised summary of Privileges to Officers travelling on the Uganda Railway, as requested.

2. It will be noticed that in the first line of footnote (3a) the words "bicycle or motor bicycle" have been added. It has been represented to me that this concession would be of considerable convenience to officers, and would result in the saving of much time and incidentally of travelling expenses. Moreover the extra expense would be no ultimate loss to the Government as the Railway revenue would benefit accordingly.

3. I trust therefore that you will not withhold your sanction to this addition.

6. "Servants' tickets" as a general rule are 2nd class but in the case of officers employing European servants one 2nd class ticket may be substituted for one 3rd class ticket.
