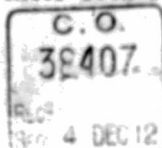

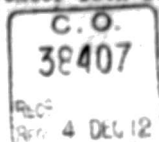

Statement of the cost of the expenses of the Postal Office, in conjunction with a Belgian office, will be employed on the delimitation of the Belgian Staff - a law of the Belgian Legislature which is the next western frontier of the Congo Free State.

The Postal office will be temporarily detached from his duties as Director of Service, East Africa Protectorate, and during the period of his employment with the Belgian Staff he will be relieved of all charges in connection with his salary, maintenance etc. The Commission of the Congo Staff will be reconstituted on December 1912 in time to commence work in the field at the close of that month. It is expected that the work of delimitation will occupy 3 months. Provision is accordingly made below for a period of 14 months employment, which covers the time occupied on the journey between the field of operations and the East Africa Protectorate in addition to the time occupied by the work of delimitation.
