With reference to your letter No. 227 of April 23rd, I have the honour to report that it is no longer anticipated that there will be any expenditure during the current financial year over and above the balance available from the original grant of £40,000 for the abolition of slavery.

2. I am in fact revoting a portion of this grant in the estimates for 1913-14. It is probable that additional funds will be necessary in subsequent years in which case I shall make provision accordingly, and should such additional funds become necessary during 1913-14 I apprehend no difficulty in providing the same from savings on other Heads of Service.
