I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No.697 of the 25th of October respecting Mrs.MacMillan's application for land, and in reply to report as follows:-

- 2. The application in 1907, referred to in your despatch, emanated from Mr.J.P.Lucy, not from Mrs.MacMillan, and the lease for 4069 acres was actually granted to this gentleman in 1909. Subsequently he submitted an application for a further area of 20 acres, but before the completion of the deeds, sold the property to a Mr.Salmon.
- 3. In 1911 Mr. Salmon applied for permission to transfer to Mrs. MacMillan, and as the deeds in the applicant's name were not completed, to simplify matters the deed for 4069 acres in Mr. Lucy's name was surrendered, and a new deed for the combined areas of 4069 and 20 acres, totalling 4089 acres, was granted to Mrs. Mac-Millan.
