With reference to paragraph 2 of your despatch No.751 of the 9th ultimo respecting the Electric Lighting of the Kilindini wharfs, I have the honour to report that the plant referred to is not of sufficient capacity to be of any great use in providing power for working the cranes or for other purposes.

Any installation required for such an object would have to be entirely separate and much more extensive than the existing small lighting plant, which could however, in the event of the adoption of the more ambitious scheme, be utilized with advantage at various points.
