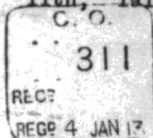

Section 2.	Section 3.	The words "from an infected place" at the end of sub-section 1 and Section 3 in the model Ordinance have been omitted from the East Africa Section. The addition of these words would appear to be not only unnecessary but dangerous. It is somewhat nice question as to whether the addition of these words do not render ultra vires such of the provisions of the Regulations in the Schedule to the model Ordinance as relate to "infected ships" which have not called at any known "infected port".
