The Governor of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

No. 212. Your telegram of 6th December Postmaster General entirely concurs in proposal(s) contained in my despatch of 7th November No. 780. Sub-postmaster(s) and Indian Clerks are interchangeable but as latter are practically impossible to get and officers from England very expensive attempt being made to train local Europeans and Africans as telegraphists and the increases asked are largely in connexion with this scheme which should be productive of great eventual economy. Postmaster-General comments particularly on extraordinary development of postal business in the 6 months during which he has been on leave which makes it impossible to comply with Treasury stipulation referred to. Increased staff is absolutely necessary and it is doubtful whether even proposals now made will prove adequate.
