Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 736 of the 8th of November respecting Mr. W. Maxwell's application for a grant of land for the purposes of the manufacture of sugar.

2. I consider it essential that either Mr. Maxwell or his representative should visit this Protectorate with a view to selecting and defining the land which he wishes to acquire, and that in the meanwhile consideration of his application should be deferred.

3. In the absence of special reasons which you may consider sufficient to warrant exceptional treatment, I do not feel disposed to entertain an application for so large a block as 12,000 acres, and I would suggest that Mr. Maxwell be advised to limit his requisition to a considerably reduced area.
