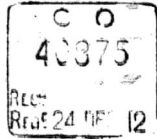

I have noted these reductions on the interleaved pages of the copy of draft Estimates annexed. No personal emoluments are reduced except in the case of the Volunteer Corps.

I have made some examination of the increase of personal emoluments, but I do not read on ^{full} ~~part~~ which will be largely superfluous when the complete estimates as laid before Leg. Co. reach us. Personally I do not take so serious a view of this point as Mr. Battersby did in his memo. on 38403. There are a great many increases in local (subordinate) establishments - more especially in the railway estimates. These tend to arise primarily as a result of increased traffic, but may also be due in part to the opening of the Nika Railway, from which earnings are estimated for 9 months. While the working expenses, if estimated for at all, are included in the Uganda Railway.

Your telegram 12th December after consultation with Executive Council suggested following reductions to the Legislative Council by whom approved December 21st Military Volunteer Corps recurrent personal emoluments £394 other charges £1455 special £2125. Miscellaneous cash counting machine £100 standard weights and measures £500. Telegraph Construction of Meru extension £2800. Agricultural Naivasha Farm purchase of livestock £1000. Public Works Department duty allowances £200 labour recruitment £500. Public Works Extraordinary item 2 ⁶⁰⁰⁰ £6000 Item 11 £3926 item 54 £6000. Total £25000.
