of 5 per cent per annum on  
their estimated value. It  
is not intended that any  
distinction should be drawn  
between plate etc. employed  
for public entertainment  
and that employed for the  
Governor's private use, as  
in practice it would be  
found difficult to  
maintain such a  
distinction.
