Sir,

With reference to your letter No. 3295/1912
of the 3rd of February on the subject of the engage-
ment of a European Clerk for the Land Office of the
East Africa Protectorate I have the honour to inform
you that we have up to the present been unable to
secure a candidate above the age of 22 with the qualifi-
cations required by the Governor.

2. We have however received an application
from a clerk in this office who appears to be fully
qualified but he will not attain the age of 22, the
minimum age at which candidates are usually engaged
for service in East Africa, until December next.

3. As the matter is urgent we shall be glad
to know whether the Secretary of State is prepared
to waive the question of age in this case. The
candidate would of course be required to pass the
usual examination by our medical adviser who would be
acquainted with the facts of the case.
