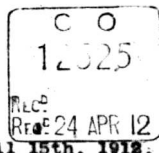

East African Protectorate

Mombassa Water Works

We have to acknowledge receipt of your letter of March 30th, 1912, enclosing copy of Despatch from the Acting Governor of the East African Protectorate respecting our account dated November 17th, 1911.

When we received your valued instructions to inquire into and report upon a scheme of the extent and cost of that proposed for Mombassa, with the view, as we understand it, that the report should assist the Secretary of State to judge as to the sufficiency and cost of the scheme, we naturally felt that it was necessary to fully consider the proposal in detail.

Our report considered the question under four heads :-

1. The quality of the water.
2. The population to be supplied and its requirements for water supply.
3. The quantity of water available.
4. The works proposed to be constructed.

We gave our views upon each of these points, which we think would be of assistance in considering the whole question.

In regard to the works, we pointed out that there were certain features in the scheme which required modification

and amendment. On going fully into the matter we found that the pipe line as arranged would not deliver the water proposed to be supplied and that it was necessary to alter the gradient of the upper length of the delivery main, which necessitated a deviation in the line of pipes. For the purpose of settling the inclination of the pipes it was necessary to make the longitudinal section to which exception is taken in the Acting Governor's Dispatch.

We also proposed that a Break Pressure Reservoir should be constructed at a level of 583 ft. above Datum so as to reduce the pressure upon the lower length of the delivery pipe.

We consider that both these modifications were improvements in the scheme, and as a matter of fact the pipe, as originally laid out, would not have delivered the quantity of water required.

In regard to the bridge across the Mwachí Creek we understood that the height of 40 feet above the water referred to the suspension bridge at the point "A" shown upon our plan, and not to the points "B" and "C" on the narrower part of the river. We submitted the drawing of this bridge to H. E. The Governor, who thought it not worth while to send it to Nairobi as he agreed in the view which was expressed by us in Paragraph 11 of the report.

If the same height of 40 feet is required at "B" and "C" the bridge can easily be altered to give the headway upon similar lines.

We went carefully into the estimates and showed that in some items they were insufficient and we therefore recommended their increase. The calculations necessitated considerable thought and work, without which it would have been impossible to give a reliable report.

We think you will agree that a report such as we submitted upon the Mombassa Scheme is valuable to the Colony, not simply in proportion to the time spent upon it, though this was necessarily considerable, but as giving our views upon the proposal based upon experience obtained during many years of important professional work.

From this point of view we submit that the charge of £257-10-0, about $\frac{1}{4}$ % upon the estimated cost of the works, is fair and reasonable.
