With reference to your letter No.14059/1912 of the 13th May and to our interview with Colonel Thesiger respecting the transport of officers and men of the Kings African Rifles from Chinde to Kismeyn in June next, I have the honour to enclose herewith copies of letters received from the Union Castle Company which show the arrangements that can be made.

- 2.
