

Gentlemen,

We thank you for your letter of the 17th instant (Ref. Passage L/1561/10) and note that you accept our offer for the transport of two officers and 110 men of the King's African Rifles from Chinde to Kismayu on the terms mentioned in our letter of the 13th May.

As already advised you, owing to an accident to our S.S. "Gascon" it has been found necessary to make other arrangements, and we are therefore sending our S.S. "Goth" down from Zanzibar to Chinde to pick up these passengers.

As far as we can tell at the present moment the "Goth" may be expected to arrive at Chinde about the 16th or 17th June. This date is, of course, more or less approximate, but we hope you will be able to arrange for the Troops to be ready for embarkation in order that there may not be any un-necessary delay. We propose to instruct our agents at Zanzibar to telegraph when the "Goth" may be expected to reach Chinde and we shall be glad if you will kindly let us know by return to whom such telegram should be addressed.
