(You asked us to look at this.)

It was agreed on 3398 that the cost  
of the two C.O. lists should be borne by  
E.A.P. & N. Nig. to the extent of  $\frac{1}{3}$  each &  
S.N., G.C., & Uganda to the extent of  $\frac{1}{9}$  each. It  
is clear that it would not be fair E.A.P.  
E.A.P. to pay in future. But it is clear <sup>also</sup> that,

unless the view taken is one of "de minimis  
non", the whole division of cost requires  
consideration. From May 1 last the Officers  
attending has been as follows: -

(Earlier in the year some W.A. ~~Officers~~  
attended but their dues were not rightly  $\frac{1}{2}$  because they  
did not get the benefit of the 1912 C.O. List.  
The fact is that whereas in 1908 the course  
was one of very largely attended by Trop. African  
Officers, now only an occasional candidate  
goes, while the number of Officers &  
candidates from elsewhere remains fairly  
constant.

Since the editors of the C.O. List I  
think one copy of the List should be  
sufficient in future (as the number of  
men attending has been largely reduced),

According to a Colonial Office Despatch of 24th February 1911 the Secretary of State signified his approval to certain recommendations contained in the Inspector General of Police's report on the re-organization of the East Africa Police, one of which was that the future training of Police Officers should be carried out at a local Training Depot at Nairobi instead of at the Royal Irish Constabulary Depot at Dublin.
