I have the honour to transmit herewith Government of India Home Department Notification No.73-C.D. dated the 12th December 1911 announcing the grant by His Imperial Majesty The King Emperor of a bonus of half a month's salary to all persons in the civil and military employ of the Government of India and shall be pleased if Mr.Secretary Harcourt will sanction a similar concession to those employes of this Office who are eligible for it.-

2. A statement showing the amounts due to each individual is appended from which it will be seen that the extra expenditure involved on eastablishment is Rs.138-12-0 or £9-5-0.-
