Sir.

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No.10341/1912 dated the 17th of April 1912 informing me that Mr.Secretar Harcourt purposes considering whether any means can be devised of relieving me of my duties in time to permit me to leave my post at the end of June or very soon after, should a final decision as to the abolition of the Agency not be arrived at by then.-

- 2. My wish was to leave the tropics before the coming monsoon but if that is impossible I should prefer to remain at my post until the monsoon is over since leave in this country during the monsoon is of no service towards the rehabilitation of health.-
- 3. The negotiations for the transfer of the work of this Agency have been placed in my hands by the Government of East Africa and as far as I can judge their completion will not be practicable before the end of July.-
- 4. In the event of their being retarded I am willing to remain at my post until the end of August if that should be any convenience to Government by obviating the necessity of sending an officer to relieve

me.-Copy of my telegram 3rd May 1912 enclosed.-I have the honour to be.
