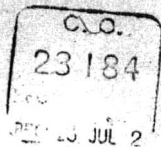

Your Excellency:-

In the note which I had the honour to address to Your Excellency's predecessor on the 19th. August 1909, it was stated that, while the financial condition of the British East Africa Protectorate at that date did not permit His Majesty's Government to take any immediate steps for the connection of the Benadir and East Africa by radio-telegraphy, the question would be considered later.

I now have the honour to inform Your Excellency that it has been decided to establish a wireless station at Mombasa, and that tenders are being invited for the erection of such a station capable of communicating at least as far as Jumbo.

In these circumstances His Majesty's Government would be glad to learn whether alterations can, if necessary, be made in the station at Jumbo so as to make it capable of communicating with the station to be erected at Mombasa.
