Zanzibar, August 9, 1912.

No. 124.

Sixteen cases of cholera with six deaths from cholera occurred in native gaol to which outbreak confined.

First case took place August 5. Source uncertain.

Following precautions taken:- Isolation of sick men, segregation (?) contracts, complete evacuation of gaol.

Town water supply which is being systematically examined shows no evidence of contamination.

Your telegram No. 130 of August 13.

You should telegraph notification to all countries which have adhered to Paris Convention, also India, Australia and South Africa. Notification for Egypt should be sent to H. M. Consul-General at Alexandria. Montenegro need only be informed of beginning and end of outbreak, but in all other cases weekly reports must be sent in accordance with Article 4.

Report to us by telegram weekly.
