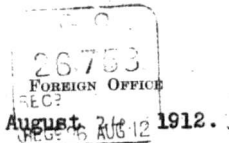

Sir:-

I am directed by Secretary Sir E. Grey to transmit to you herewith, for the information of Mr. Secretary Harcourt, a translation of a note from the German Chargé d'Affaires forwarding the Commission of Appointment of Herr Adolf von Hedemann as German Consul at Mombasa "for the Uganda and East Africa Protectorates, "and also for the East African Coast territory adjoining the latter up to Cape Guardafui".

As Herr von Hedemann is a Consul de Carrière, Sir E. Grey proposes, with Mr. Harcourt's concurrence, to take steps for the issue of The King's Exequatur in his favour, as regards Uganda and the East Africa Protectorate only, the remainder of his jurisdiction being in Italian territory.

Sir E. Grey would also be glad if steps could be taken for the recognition of Herr Freundt as Acting

Your Excellency:-

His Majesty the Emperor and King, my August Master, has been pleased to appoint Vice-Consul von Hedemann to be German Consul at Mombasa, the necessary arrangements having been made for appointing a Consul "de carrière" at that place.

I have the honour to transmit herewith the letter of appointment and to request that the Exequatur of the British Government may be obtained and communicated to me in due course.

It is anticipated that Consul von Hedemann will assume his Consular duties at Mombasa for a short time, and will then be granted a long leave of absence. In his absence, and in the absence on leave also of the Interpreter Wassmuss, the affairs of the Consulate will be entrusted to Herr Freundt, Interpreter ad interim.
