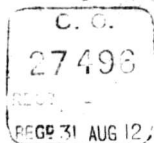

Outbreak of Cholera. Gaol has been declared infected district, but this has been absolutely evacuated closed since August 9th. there have not been recognized cases anywhere else. All prisoners are at Quarantine Station, Prison Island. Such cases as occurred amongst them have been at once removed to strictly isolated infection hospital, Gulioni, outskirts of town. May we in these circumstances declare ourselves free? Trade seriously affected by measures taken against us.

My telegram No. 134 of August 16th. 59 cases of Cholera  
39 deaths from Cholera, 17 sporadic cases occurred in  
country districts, remainder confined prisoners.

Town free. Precautions continued as before. Epidemic  
well under control.
