Sir:-

At a recent meeting of the Technical Commission of the Colonial Economic Committee the question of the necessity of constructing new railways in the German Colonies was discussed. The following projects were recommended by the Commission:-

- The construction of a branch line from the East African "Mittelland" Railway to the populous districts of Urundi and Ruanda;
- 2. The continuation of the East African Northern Railway to Aruscha;
- 3. The construction of a railway to the oil palm district in Anacho in Togoland.

These projects have been taken up by the Imperial Colonial Office and plans are already being prepared.

With regard to the first project, it is reported that

that the districts of Urundi and Ruanda have a population of about four millions and possess about 500,000 cattle and two million sheep and goats; the soil is also suitable for agriculture and the district is particularly fitted by its cool climate for settlement by Europeans.
