Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 8th ultimo (38731/11) and its enclosures, recommending the award of a special pension to Matthew Wellington, who is retiring from the service of the East Africa Protectorate.

In reply I am to request you to express to Mr. Secretary Harcourt Their Lordships' regret that They cannot regard the services rendered by Wellington some 22 years before he entered the service of the Protectorate as justifying the award of a special pension from Protectorate funds; They can therefore only concur in the grant to him of the gratuity of £16, for which he is qualified under the Regulations, in respect of his service in the Protectorate.
