The papers had better be kept for Mr. Bottomley, who will be back from leave in a week or so. I fear that we shall have to send the Governor our draft despatch with the excision of approval ⁱⁿ his curious method of engaging Surveyors direct, and tell him that relief will have to be sought, in so far as it may be required, by addition to the number of his staff coupled with adherence to recognized methods of selection already recognised, including direct engagement of him at approved rates of salary.
