I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Lambert's letter of the 1st instant (40368/1911), and the accompanying copy of a despatch from the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate respecting the grant of an allowance to married officers in respect of the passages of their wives and families by the ships of the Union Castle Line.

In reply I am to request you to inform Mr. Secretary Harcourt that they concur in his proposal to inform the Governor that, in cases of the kind described in the second and third paragraphs of his despatch, the allowance may be granted to an officer for the double journey provided that he takes a return ticket for his wife or family and gives an assurance that he intends to travel one way with them.
