Note on the Mudhol State.

Mudhol is a State in the Bombay Presidency with an area of 368 square miles and a population of 65,000. The Chief, Meherban Malojirao Vyankatrao Raje Ghorpade alias Nanasahab, is a Hindu. He was born in 1884, educated in Kolhapur under European tutors, and invested with full powers over his State in 1904. He is entitled in India to a salute of 9 guns as a personal distinction.
