Mr. HARCOURT have ascertained by telegraph from the Acting Governor that there is no ground whatever for the suspicion that the Northern Masai are moving still further northwards.

Earl WINTERTON: Is it not a fact that any steps taken in connection with the Masai have been taken on the recommendation of their own chiefs and not at the request of any of the white settlers?

Mr. HARCOURT: Certainly, no action has been taken at the request of white settlers. As to the general provisions I would refer the hon. Member to the rather full statement I made late in the autumn last year.
