I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Read's letter of the 30th ultimo (30361/1912) and its accompanying copy of a letter, with enclosure, from the War Office recommending Mr. W. Henfrey and his wife for appointment as Superintendent and Matron respectively of the Lunatic Asylum at Nairobi.

In reply I am to request you to inform Mr. Secretary Harcourt that they offer no objection to his proposal that in order to enable Mrs. Henfrey to proceed to the Protectorate with her husband a passage at the public expense should be granted to her now, although she will not take over the duties of her appointment until the 1st April next.

2. An outfit allowance of £25 may be paid to Mr. Henfrey, ~~and the~~

~~the~~ agreement with which you enter with Mr. Henfrey should make provision for the payment of a uniform allowance of £10 p.m.

3. You should obtain from ~~both~~ Mr. & Mrs. Henfrey medical certificates to show that they are physically fit for service in East Africa. As Mr. Henfrey is a ~~person~~ warrant officer of the R.A.M.C.,

may accept certificates from an Officer of the R.A.M.C. both for Mr. & Mrs. Henfrey instead of requiring them to visit the M.A.

To this Dept. In the absence of such certificates, they should be examined by a M.A. in this office in the usual way.

4. Arrangements

should be made for Mr. & Mrs. Henfrey to leave ~~leave~~ Southampton by the N.C. steamer due to ~~leave~~ sail for Mombasa on the 1st November.

It is understood that they will take with them their child, but the cost of its child's passage will be paid by Mr. Henfrey.

5. A special clause
should be added to
Mr. Honfrey's agreement

(to the effect that he will not
~~be required to take up his duties after appointment and vice versa~~
before to draw a salary until

the 1st of April 1913.

Consequently, the clause

in the agreement which
states that half pay will
commence from the date

of embarkation & full
pay from the date of
arrival at Mombasa
must be deleted.

6. I am to request that you will report
you ~~and inform me without~~
to his office
as soon as

the agreements are signed.
