VENEREAL DISEASE.

Can arrange for special training of a limited number of Medical Officers in Tropical African Service. Enquiries names and proposed date of commencement. Will write further as to fee payable.

The only men whom we want to send to the course is Dr. Owen - see file 4316 E.A: the War Office seem to expect a number of men to go.

As a matter of fact, however, all Uganda medical officers ought to attend a venereal disease course, though in recent years this has not been pressed. There is, however, no possibility of sending Dr. Neilson, the new temporary Uganda Medical Officer, as he must leave as soon as possible; nor are there any Uganda Medical Officers on leave who could attend a course if held, as you suggest, in September.

?Acknowledge receipt - thank Army Council - say that Secretary of State would prefer a month's course commencing Monday 2 September - that names will be communicated in due course - that he will be glad to hear as soon as convenient that the fee is likely to be - and then note

It is perhaps worth consideration whether, as soon as we know what the fee will be, the East and West African Colonies and Protecorates should be asked generally whether they would recommend that all medical officersbe required (or encouraged) to at end a month's course in veneral disease work during their leave.

I presume that a man attending such a course should be allowed (1) rail fare and 5/- a day if attending it on first appointment, and (2) rail fare and lodging allowance of 2/6d. a day if he is on leave with full pay, while, if he happens to be an East African Medical Officer and his leave has been extended on 1 pay to enable him to take or complete the course, he should in accordance with our usual practice receive an additional 5/- a day training allowance for such period as he is on half pay.

I suppose there is no question of the War Office finding board and lodging at the Royal Army Medical. College for men taking the course, as is done by the Schools of tropical medicine in London or Liverpool.

h any event, it seems doubtful whether the Government is called on to provide board and lodging free or an allowance in lieu; although it might be difficult to justify the distinction thus made between the treatment given to men on first appointment while at one of the Schools of Tropical Medicine and the Royal Army Medical College.
