Wishes to withdraw application made on behalf of Mr. Heatley by Heatley & Lyle & ask that the 5000 acres already allotted to himself may be increased to 10000 acres. Request early decision in order that land office may be inf. in time with Survey.

Mr. Heatley's Tidies.

Please see the minutes, particularly the latter ones, and the telegram on Gov/11970.

Mr. Heatley now abandons his application for 5,000 acres each for himself and his three partners, and asks for 10,000 acres in all, namely the 5,000 applied for in his own name, which we have already consented to allow, and an additional 5,000 also in his own name. This, be it noted, is the extent to which the Secretary of State indicated his willingness to go in the telegram of the 7th of May. *Gov* *11970*

I think the application might now be allowed, as proposed in my first minute on 11970, to him, loving new holdings such a number of Europeans down reasonable.

So inform Mr. Ley, and tell the Governor he has proved, adding that this is now
