I am now able to report that, in accordance with the arrangements made last August, the audit of the accounts of capital expenditure on the construction of the Magadi Railway to the 31st March last has been completed by Mr. J. C. Fisher of this Dept.

As the figures rendered by the Magadi Co in their statement are in part only provisionally apportioned, as yet, between Railway and Port works. I propose, with your concurrence, to defer the issue of a formal certificate of audit until the completion of the undertakings.

The point has arisen in the course of the examination to which I desire to draw attention. The Contract (A. 18) provides that all materials shipped to the Protectorate for the purposes of the contract shall be inspected by an Engineer to be specially appointed by the Crown Agents for the duty. I understand that Messrs. Ainsley, Son & Henderson, who are Consulting Engineers to the Magadi Co and are in receipt of a fee of £12,000 for work performed in that capacity, are at the same time acting as Inspectors on behalf of Her Government, and that all the supplies are

are passed on her sole certificate. I am
not aware whether his arrangement has
been sanctioned by the S. of State.

Sir,

We beg to refer to your letter of the 14th May last
with regard to the auditing of our Accounts of Capital
Expenditure, as provided for by Clause 34 of the Contract
dated 13th April 1912, for the construction of the Magadi
Railway and with a view to the rights of His Majesty's
Government under Clause 48 of the said Contract.

In accordance with the verbal arrangements which have
been made, after a preliminary examination of the Company's
books by Mr. Stevenson of the Colonial Office, we now beg to
submit an account (in duplicate) showing the Capital Ex-
penditure in connection with the Magadi Branch Line and the
Port Works up to the end of March last. Subsequent accounts
of Capital Expenditure will be rendered at intervals of six
months from the above date. We shall be pleased to keep our
books available for inspection as and when convenient.

As mentioned to Mr. Stevenson the figures must be sub-
ject to adjustments and additions on the completion of the
whole scheme, firstly because the salaries and incidental
expenses of our Engineering Staff must be apportioned between
the two Headings of Expenditure, and secondly because the
Management and Office expenses have to be apportioned in like
manner.
