I have suggested two slight alterations, one giving the short title of the Act recited the other correcting the reference to the 1903 Warrant, which was one of King Edward not King George.

The Warrant refers to a Treaty of the boundaries hereto annexed but no Treaty has been supplied <sup>not even officially</sup> for the tracing. I suggest that it should be of full description & then have the Warrant typed & send to the King for signature, explaining its purpose.

W H I T R E A L L by an Act passed in the Fifth year of the Reign of Her  
late Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "An Act to amend an Act made in the  
Sixth year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third intituled  
"An Act to regulate the Ecclesiastical Courts Ad 1801"  
ACT TO AUTHORISE THE ARCHBISHOP OF CANTERBURY OR THE BISHOP OF UGANDA FOR  
THE EXERCISING OF CONSECRATION TO THE OFFICE OF A CHURCH PERSONAGE BEING  
SUBJACENT OR SITTING IN ONE OF HER MAJESTY'S DOMINIONS" AND WHEREAS  
the said Act did among other things enact that it should be  
lawful for Licence by warrant under our Royal Signet and Sign Manual being  
first obtained to nominate and appoint such Subjects or Citizens  
of any Foreign Kingdom or State to be Clerks in any Foreign Country as in  
the said Act mentioned AND it was by the second Section of the said Act  
further enacted that such Bishop or Bishop so consecrated might exercise  
within such limits as might from time to time be assigned for that purpose  
in Foreign Countries by his spiritual jurisdiction over the ministers of  
British Congregations of the Church of England and over such other  
Protestant congregations as might be desirous of placing themselves under  
his or their authority AND WHEREAS under and by virtue of our Warrant under  
His Royal Signet and Sign Manual dated the 22nd day of May 1903 declared  
it to be our Royal Will and Pleasure that the then Bishops in Uganda Mombasa  
and Zanzibar in Eastern Equatorial Africa and their successors should  
exercise spiritual jurisdiction within the limits severally specified by

WHEREAS Royal Warrant of the said 22nd day of May 1903 AND WHEREAS it  
 is expedient that the limits within which the Bishops in Uganda and  
 Mombasa respectively shall exercise spiritual jurisdiction shall be  
 altered NOW IT IS OUR ROYAL WILL & PLEASURE and WE do by this our Warrant  
 under Our Royal Signet and Sign Manual as from this date revoke the said  
 Royal Warrant of 22nd May 1903 so far as limits ~~are~~ <sup>led to</sup> therby assigned within  
 which the said Bishops of Uganda and Mombasa and their several successors  
 should exercise spiritual jurisdiction and in pursuance of the said second  
 section of the said Act TO ASSIGN ALL that part of Eastern Equatorial  
 Africa which is or may hereafter be comprised within the Uganda Protectorate  
 And also the Native Reserves in the Nyanza Province of the East Africa  
 Protectorate lying to the East of the Lake Victoria Nyanza and bounded on  
 the North by the Malaba River from the lake to Mount Elgon and the source  
 of the Suam River on the East as indicated on the tracing hereto annexed by  
 the Eastern Boundary of the Native Reserves lying within the Nyanza Province  
 viz North Kavirondo, Kisumu District, South Kavirondo including Kisii Nandi  
<sup>and the small Capital town Boni</sup>  
 Lumbwa, Buret and Solik Reserves as the limits within which the Right Reverend  
 John Jamieson Willis the present Bishop in Uganda and his successors shall  
 henceforth as Bishop of the Church of England in Uganda exercise spiritual  
 jurisdiction over the Ministers of the Church of England and other persons  
 above mentioned. And it is also Our Royal Will and Pleasure that and WE  
 do further by this our Warrant under Our Royal Signet & Sign Manual  
 assign that part of the German East Africa which being West of Longitide

<sup>38 east is North of latitude 8° South</sup> And also that part of British  
<sup>led</sup>  
 East Africa within the East Africa Protectorate which lie to the East of  
 the said Native Reserves which lie within the Nyanza Province as the  
 limits within which the Right Reverend William George Peel the present

Bishop in Mombasa and his successors shall henceforth as Bishops of the Church of England in Mombasa exercise spiritual jurisdiction over the Ministers of the Church of England and other persons above mentioned PROVIDED ALWAYS that it shall at all times hereafter be competent for us our successors to revoke this Our Royal Warrant and in accordance with the second section of the said Act to assign such limits as may from time to time seem expedient within which the said Right Reverend John Jamieson Willis and the Right Reverend William George Peel and each of them their and each of their successors shall exercise such spiritual jurisdiction as aforesaid.
