I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter 30600/181 of October 5th, requesting a copy of the requirements of the Veterinary Pathologist of the East African Protectorate would be set by the Supply of the Veterinary Bulletin of the Tropical Diseases Bureau.

2. I sent the correspondence to Mr. J. T. Shipton, the editor of the Tropical Veterinary Bulletin. He expresses the opinion that the Tropical Veterinary Bulletin cannot be held to take the place of the East African requirements to extent.

3. On this point, I concur. The requirements of space alone prevent the publication of such a detailed account of methods as is required by a certain of Pathologist. He must have access to original papers.
