If the facts are as stated in this letter, I do not understand why Sir P. Girouard thought it necessary to see Mr. Cobb in this country or to request us to do so. We are not in a position here to mark out boundary lines and settle the position and area of forest blocks.

I should be inclined to send the <sup>Protectorate</sup> a copy of this correspondence with Mr. Cobb, and to request <sup>them</sup> to <sup>settle</sup> ~~arrange~~ any outstanding questions in accordance with the approval already given as soon as they can arrange with Mr. Cobb to do so, and tell Mr. Cobb what we have said to the Officer Administering the Government.

Sir,

35,000 acres agreed to be granted from Government land.

In continuation of my letter of the 11th inst. in further reply to your letter No 20518/1912 dated the 11th inst. I have the honor to inform you:

1. That the only matters now outstanding with regard to the land agreed to be granted to us are:

- (a) to settle on the ground the actual positions of the boundary lines which have been agreed to in principle, and
- (b) to settle the position, areas & boundaries of those pieces of forest which it has been agreed to grant, so that they shall conform to the agreed requirements of providing sufficient timber of good quality for full estate development, & of being conveniently situated for the economical working of the whole property.

2. That my brother, G. Beatty Cobb, who was associated with me in the original application, dated June 8, 1907, who with myself still represents the tin mining enterprise of the Trust, and who

3. Our present application refers only to our request that the two outstanding questions mentioned above, para 1. (a) & (b), should be settled with as much despatch as possible.

4. That the development conditions to which you refer are those set out by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State in his letters of December 16, 1907 - January 8, 1908 which will doubtless be introduced as comments in the lease.

5. And finally that the number of persons interested in the results of the application have increased, while the area of land remains the same, i.e. therefore smaller proportionately to each individual interested.
