Sir,

In reply to the letter No 52817/12
of the 20th of October I would
suggest the following with regard
to the Moroccan Wireless Station
in its relations with the Italian
Station at Gibraltar.

(a)

(a) The apparatus will doubtless be
 Masconi. I believe that under
 the existing agreements no
 station shore station can
 communicate with another
shore station unless Masconi
 apparatus be used at the
 latter.

(b) It is desired that the Grimsby
 station shall exchange telegrams
directly with the Mornhose
 station, & serve as intermediary
 for telegraphic correspondence
 between the Wireless Stations

in the Italian Benadic Colony and such places as can be conveniently served by circulation via Mombasa.

(c) It is the intention that the attendance at the Mombasa Station should extend over the whole day hours - i.e. the Station will always be open to send or receive messages.

(d) The tariff proposed (i.e. credits required by the Government of British East Africa) in respect of traffic between British East Africa and Uganda on the one side, and

and the Benado colony on the other side, is 50 centime per wood for the combined wireless and land line services. Italian Government messages would be admitted at half rates if a similar concession were made by the Italian authorities in respect of British Government messages.
