Dear Mr. Read,

At a meeting held this morning at the Board of Agriculture the question of a successor to Dr. Hannigan was carefully discussed by Messrs. Stockman, Sturdy and myself.

It was decided to strongly advise the Government to appoint a qualified man to replace Dr. Hannigan. It was pointed out that not only had the Veterinary Pathologist ^{to} frequently leave the Laboratory to carry out investigations in the field, ^{but} that in October the pathologist's leave would fall due and that it was more than essential to have a qualified man left in charge of the Laboratory.

The salary attached to the present post is £300 per annum but to obtain a qualified man this salary would have to be increased to £400. It would not however be necessary to apply for a further sum at the present time from the Treasury savings in this particular Vote as there are sufficient ~~fund~~ funds to meet this extra expenditure during the present financial year.
