do the work around Marsabit. The Officer Commanding the Northern Frontier District should then insist that all caravans carry sufficient hay and grain for the journey. With good feeding the camels of the Frontier Transport Service would retain their condition, sore backs would be less prevalent, and the mortality from disease decrease.

I cannot make suggestions regarding the other routes throughout the Northern Frontier District, but it is highly probable that along them fodder and grain depots would also be required.
