Sir Giddes.

The facts are set out in our letter to the Treasury of the 30th September on Gov/2904/1.

The late Lt. Wright was originally employed on the Uganda Railway at a salary of £300 per annum. He was invalided out of the service, but was subsequently out of sheer poverty given a minor appointment in the Protectorate at a salary of £120 per annum. The Treasury in calculating the compassionate allowance that might be made to his widow did not insist on a limit of six months pay of the appointment which he held at the time of his death, as they might have done, but allowed six months pay calculated on the average salary drawn by him during the last two years of his service; that is, they allowed a gratuity of £100 instead of £60. The case is a very sad one, but I do not see how we can urge the Treasury to do more than they have done.

? Reply that Mr Harcourt regrets that he is not in a position to approve of the grant of a further gratuity from East Africa Protectorate funds.
